It is designed to build protective factors for children and empower parents to be the primary prevention agents for their children. To date, FAST has been implemented in over 700 communities around the world. FAST has reached children aged 3 weeks to 15 years in rural, suburban, and urban communities.

There are four different FAST models, each serving a distinct group of children and their families.

Baby FAST serves young mothers (ages 14-21), their infants (ages 0-3), and the teen mothers' support persons.

Early Childhood FAST serves children in Head Start, pre-school or early childhood programs and their families.

Elementary School FAST, which is the most common FAST model, serves children in Kindergarten through 5th grade and their families.

The National Center drives that philosophy, or mission, through four program areas: Born to Learn, Professional Development, Meld and Advocacy. All of these program areas work through a strong network of state leaders and partners.

The four-part intervention model known as Born to Learn delivers its mission-based program through intermediaries (parent educators) to the ultimate recipients (parents), while Professional Development is delivered directly to end users (professionals). Meld is a facilitated group model that draws on peer support. Advocacy works through both public and private sectors to promote

positive policies for young families.
