Resource Overview Families and Schools Together (FAST) is a well-researched, theory-based program for children and their families. It is designed to build protective factors for children and empower parents to be the primary prevention agents for their children. To date, FAST has been implemented in over 700 communities around the world. FAST has reached children aged 3 weeks to 15 years in rural, suburban, and urban communities.

There are four different FAST models, each serving a distinct group of children and their families.

Baby FAST serves young mothers (ages 14-21), their infants (ages 0-3), and the teen mothers' support persons.

Early Childhood FAST serves children in Head Start, pre-school or early childhood programs and their families.

Elementary School FAST, which is the most common FAST model, serves children in Kindergarten through 5th grade and their families.

Or if you figure 10 families served per multi-family group cycle, cycles have cost the local collaborative from \$3,000 to \$18,000 per program cycle. The campaign was developed to address the differences in the way girls and boys experience adolescence and to develop gender-specific programs to meet their unique needs.

Resource Overview Tar Wars is a one-time, one-hour classroom presentation requiring minimal preparation and follow-up. The program can be implemented at any time during the school year, and the scripted lesson plan can be easily incorporated into your classroom's daily curriculum. During the classroom presentation, students will engage in a series of six interactive activities designed to increase their knowledge of the short-term effects of tobacco use, help them identify reasons why people use tobacco products, and prompt them to think critically about tobacco advertising. Tar Wars is consistent with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) *Guidelines for School Health Programs to Prevent Tobacco Use* and is one of the building blocks in a comprehensive tobacco prevention education plan.

Resource Overview Preschool teachers have always taught content. When they made recipe cards so children could count the cups of flour needed to make a cake, they were teaching math. When they challenged children to find out what kinds of leaves a caterpillar likes to eat, they were teaching science.

However, in the last few decades, the knowledge base about teaching and learning content in preschool classrooms has grown. More and more research has shown us the value of teachers' making intentional efforts to guide children's thinking and support their learning as they interact with children throughout the day, plan individual and small-and large-group activities, and organize the classroom environment. For a teacher to be effective, he or she must have a deep understanding of content and the ability to observe what children are doing and then provide appropriate experiences to help them progress.
