Since 1983, our evidence-based Nurturing philosophy has helped families from all over the world and in all branches of the military improve their parenting skills. The long-term goals are to prevent recidivism in families receiving social services, lower the rate of multi-parent teenage pregnancies, reduce the rate of juvenile delinquency and alcohol abuse, and stop the intergenerational cycle of child abuse by teaching positive parenting behaviors.

Darkness to Light's Stewards of Children Training

Target Audience

All adults, but especially those who work or volunteer with children and/or youth in any setting, including childcare, schools, churches, recreation, sports, and many other youth serving organizations, as well as parents and other adult relatives of children and youth, and any adults who care about the safety of children and youth

Curriculum Summary

Evidence-based; Aligned with the National Head Start Standards.

Darkness to Light is a national nonprofit organization that seeks to empower adults to prevent child sexual abuse. Their programs raise awareness and educate adults how to prevent, recognize, and react responsibly to child sexual abuse.

Stewards of Children Training is an evidence-informed curriculum that teaches adults the information and skills needed to prevent child sexual abuse. As a result of the 2-hour training, adults learn to identify risky situations for child sexual abuse, skills to prevent child sexual abuse, signs that it is occurring and how to react responsibly (including reporting) if child sexual abuse is suspected, disclosed or discovered.

Stewards of Children Training features documentary-style film, hosted teaching of specific skills, and a workbook. The workbook cost is \$10 per individual workbook and can be ordered in larger quantities at reduced rates.

An Authorized Facilitator leads each training session using the training film, workbook and group discussion about key points. It has been independently evaluated and shown to be effective at increasing adult knowledge and changing child protective behaviors of adults.

Training Information

To provide Stewards of Children training, the presenter must attend a one-day Facilitator Workshop provided by Darkness to Light, thereby becoming an Authorized Facilitator. Cost of the Facilitator Workshop is \$450 per person, payable to Darkness to Light. The National Children's Advocacy Center, through an agreement with Darkness to Light, offers Facilitator Workshops several times per year in Huntsville.

The goal of YJT is to provide parents and guardians with the knowledge and skills that promote resilience and help family members better cope with life's challenges and reach their full potential. Your Journey Together shows parents how to use ordinary, everyday routines, activities and interactions as resilience- building opportunities.

Trauma Sensitive

Your Journey Together is designed to be delivered with sensitivity to the prevalence of trauma in the lives of vulnerable children and families. The YJT curriculum was developed to reflect the six key principles of a trauma-informed approach promulgated by the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration(2014): safety; trustworthiness; peer support; collaboration; empowerment, and cultural, historical and gender issues. Circle of Security Parenting

Curriculum Summary

At Circle of Security International, we focus on training providers with many different backgrounds and from many different disciplines to help caregivers connect with the children in their lives. The Circle of Security figure is a central visual used as part of interventions for caregivers, all of which are focused on helping caregivers reflect upon children's attachment needs in order to promote secure attachment with a child.

Here are some founding principles that underlie the Circle of Security models of intervention:

1. Attachment problems in infancy and early childhood increase the probability of psychopathology later on in life.
2. Secure attachment relationships with caregivers are a protective factor for infants and preschoolers, setting the foundation for social competence and promoting effective functioning of the emotion regulation and stress response systems.
3. The quality of the attachment relationship is amenable to change.
4. Learning, including therapeutic change, occurs from within a secure base relationship.
5. Lasting change in the attachment relationship comes from caregivers' developing specific relationship capacities rather than learning techniques to manage behavior.
6. All caregivers want what is best for their children.

Triple P is used in more 30 countries and has been shown to work across cultures, socio-economic groups and in many different kinds of family structures.

Triple P fits the needs of every family, whether they are struggling with temper tantrums or sleeping patterns, parents in conflict with their child or with each other, or have children with additional needs, including those struggling with their mental health.

Triple P programs draw on social learning, cognitive behavioral and developmental theory, in addition to research into risk factors associated with the development of social and behavioral problems in children. We equip parents with the skills and confidence they need to be able to manage any family issue.

While Triple P is almost universally successful in improving behavioral problems, more than half of Triple P's 17 parenting strategies focus on developing positive relationships, attitudes and conduct.

Accessing in-person training from our certified trainers and Healthy Families America (HFA) national office staff is one of the great benefits of being an affiliate.

All Staff must receive thorough orientation, as well as what we call core training. There are two core trainings:

- Foundations for Family Support (FFS)
- Parent Survey for Community Outreach(PSCO)

FFS is required for family support specialists (those who conduct home visits). PSCO is required for family resource specialists (those who conduct the initial assessment/parent surveys) with families.

These are four-day in-person trainings and can only be administered by HFA certified trainers. Direct service staff must receive these trainings within six months of hire.

Core training requirements for supervisors and program managers:

All supervisors and program managers need BOTH Parent Survey for Community Outreach (PSCO) and Foundations for Family Support (FFS) core trainings.

Additionally:

- Supervisors and program managers must stay for one extra day of core training (following both PSCO and FFS). This is referred to as "fifth day" training, as it typically occurs on the Friday after trainees have spent Monday–Thursday in core training. Supervisors need to obtain this training within 6 months after being hired. Program managers need this training within the first 18 months of employment. Program managers must also attend Implementation Training (within their first 18 months of being on the job).

Quenching the FatherThirst: Developing a Dad is a breakthrough curriculum developed by the National Center for Fathering to train men to become responsible fathers/father figures that love, know and guide their children to success. This research and theory-based curriculum is a blueprint for guided programming interventions with fathers and is designed to be useful for fathers in any social service-based setting (courts, prisons, employment agencies, hospitals, drug rehabilitation centers, etc.) in any fathering situation (teen, single, married, divorced, non-custodial, step, father-figures etc.).
